Spellings, Reading & Homework

- To set homework and receive the children's work, we will be using something called 'Seesaw'. The children can log in to this themselves, using the letter that will be sent home and parents will be invited to join the account via email so do please sign up.
- The children will receive either a piece of maths work or English work on alternating weeks.
- They will then receive some optional activities, linked to our topic, to do at home. They can choose to do some or all of them.
- Children will receive a weekly list of spellings to practise at home. You can choose how to practise these yourselves, however I will give some ideas when I send them out on Seesaw. They will then be tested on these at school the following week.
- Children need to be reading at least four times a week, even if it is just for 5 minutes. We will change the books on Mondays and Thursdays if we see that an adult has written in the reading record. I appreciate you might struggle for time so a signature is fine. If you finish the book before this, feel free to read the book again to build on children's fluency, talk about the book and ask children questions or read a book of your choice from home.


Phonics

- ❖ All year one children will take part in the phonics screening check at the end of the year.
- ❖ This is a compulsory government assessment to monitor their phonic knowledge.
- ❖ This involves a short 1:1 assessment reading real and made up words containing graphemes the children will have been taught during the year. We refer to the made up words as 'alien words'. The screen is split into two sections, each containing 20 words for the children to read. They can segment the words but they must then read the word in order to receive the mark. Our brain will occasionally want to automatically correct the alien word into a real word so children do need to ensure that they are reading the words as they have segmented them.
- ❖ Children receive a daily 20 minute phonic session. There is also a big focus on phonics in other lessons and encouraging them to apply their knowledge of phonemes and graphemes to their reading and writing.
- ❖ Support for the assessment can begin now by encouraging children to practise their spelling and read daily. Also by asking children what sound they have learnt that day in school. Children will receive a set of alien word flash cards for you to practise at home. We will then send out a new set later in the year. Do feel free to create your own aliens and alien words at home to practise in the meantime.



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
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
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
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
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
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
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
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Drinks and snacks
