This was made possible by buying into the local sports partnership SSPAN and the Wreake Valley Football Leagues.	More competitions/events taken part in. The use of Premier Education to provide PE lessons to all year groups at some point during the year.	Staff and pupil voice indicates they have enjoyed their lessons by premier and staff have developed skills as a result of watching and supporting the lessons.		
Increasing opportunities for as many children as possible to participate in the O&A residential.	Only 2 pupils are not going to attend the residential meaning 94% approx. are. This means these children can access activities unavailable by the school.
