Uniform Policy 2026 - 2028

At Broomfield we believe uniform is important for several reasons:

- promotes a sense of pride in the school;
- promotes a feeling of community and belonging;
- is practical and smart;
- is not distracting in class (as fashion clothes might be);
- makes pupils feel equal to their peers in terms of appearance;
- is regarded as suitable, and good value for money, by most parents and carers;
- has been designed with health and safety in mind.

Non-compliance of the School Uniform Policy

The Headteacher and school staff will expect all pupils to follow the school uniform policy and will discuss with pupils and/or parents breaches of the school's rules on appearance or uniform. Pupils will be reminded of the uniform policy and asked to remove items or not to wear specific items the next day. If pupils do not comply with the school uniform policy the following day, consequences may take place, such as:

- Confiscation of banned item(s) for collection by parent / carer
- Having to wear spare uniform supplied by school for the day
- Parents contacted and asked to bring in the appropriate clothing.

Affordability

In line with Government guidance, our uniform is as cost friendly as possible for our families and therefore there are no requirements for any clothing to be branded. This means our families can choose the most affordable places to buy our uniform from.

Second-hand uniform for families is available from our school office. We keep a variety of sizes and uniforms that are in good condition which are freely available for our families.

Uniform Policy

The uniform policy requires that all children wear:

White polo shirts, shirts or blouses.

Navy Blue/Black trousers – navy is preferred.

Red jumpers or cardigans – plain or ones with the school logo on.

Red checked summer dresses – may be worn in the warmer months.

Navy/Black shorts – may be worn in the warmer months.

Navy/black pinafore dresses.

All children should have a named pair of indoor shoes to change into during the day. Black plimsoles are preferred. Please check that these remain in good condition throughout the year.

PE Kits:

Children should attend school in their PE kits on their PE days. PE kits are:

Red polo or T-shirt (plain)

Navy/Black shorts

Indoor plimsoles – for indoor PE

Trainers – if PE is outside

In the colder weather, children may wear a tracksuit. This should be **navy/black** and **plain**.

*Football kits **are not** permitted.

Jewellery

- One pair of small sleeper or stud earrings is permissible. Pupils will need to remove these for PE and Swimming lessons or ideally not wear them for school on these days.
- No rings /bangles/bracelets/necklaces (unless they are for a religious beliefs).
- A standard watch is preferred rather than fitbits/smart watches.

Nails

- No acrylic/false nails.
- No nail varnish is permitted.

Hair

- Simple black or red hair bands are preferred.
- Hair colour should be natural, coloured hair dye/spray is not permitted.

Outer Wear

No gloves, scarves, hoodies, hats, cap or any other “outside wear” when inside the building.
